HWTF CHAIR LT. GOV. BEVERLY PERDUE TO PARTICIPATE IN HEALTH SCREENING AT CIAA TOURNAMENT

Old North State Focuses CIAA Booth on Tobacco Cessation

(Raleigh, NC) – While the basketball players keep the fans entertained during the 2005 CIAA Tournament at the RBC Center in Raleigh, physicians from the Old North State Medical Society (ONSMS) will be on hand to help the fans and players stay healthy. ONSMS will host a booth all week during the tournament to offer free medical screenings and provide information about tobacco prevention and cessation for teenagers. ONSMS's statewide teen tobacco prevention and cessation initiative is funded by the NC Health and Wellness Trust Fund (HWTF).

The medical screenings are free-of-charge to CIAA fans and include tests for cholesterol, glucose, and high blood pressure as well as bone-marrow registration. On Thursday March 3rd at 7:45 pm, Lt. Gov. Beverly Perdue, HWTF chair, will have her own blood pressure taken at the ONSMS booth in Section 110 of the Main Concourse.

CIAA fans can also get information about ONSMS's statewide youth initiative "*Physicians United for Teen Health: Keeping Our Kids Tobacco Free*". This initiative is designed to educate teens and their caregivers about resources available to young people who want to quit smoking.
