NC Teens Celebrate 10th Anniversary of Kick Butts Day! Local tobacco prevention events reflect vitality of NC's TRU campaign

Raleigh –Hundreds of teens across the state will rally on Wednesday in support of kicking butts – cigarette butts, that is. The activities mark the tenth anniversary of "Kick Butts Day," an annual (statewide or national) event designed to empower young people in the fight to reduce and prevent tobacco use.

Kick Butts activities in your area may include youth-led health fairs and information booths, petition signings in support of 100% tobacco-free school policies, performances and contests. A complete listing of events is provided on page two.

The Kick Butts events are sponsored by community-based teen tobacco prevention programs. Most of these local efforts are funded by the NC Health and Wellness Trust Fund (HWTF) through its statewide teen tobacco use prevention and cessation initiative. Teen advocates are leading these events with the same enthusiasm they brought to HWTF's TRU (Tobacco. Reality. Unfiltered) multi-media campaign. In December of 2004, North Carolina jumped from 30 to 21 in the Campaign for Tobacco Free Kids' annual ranking on state funding for tobacco prevention and was recognized as one of the states making the most improvement in funding programs to protect young people from the dangers of tobacco use.

"The North Carolina Health and Wellness Trust Fund and our local grantees have been turning up the heat on tobacco prevention, and the Kick Butts activities further reflect that energy and commitment," said Alison K. McLaurin, HWTF's marketing and public affairs director. "This is a great and important opportunity for communities to tune in to what their young people are saying about the dangers of tobacco as well as what they're doing to save lives. ."

Currently, tobacco use is North Carolina's leading cause of preventable death. Approximately 36 percent of high school students in North Carolina smoke, with more than 3,000 kids taking up this fatal habit each day. Accordingly to recent statistics, roughly one-third of these young people will die prematurely from a tobacco-related disease.

ABOUT TRU:

Tobacco. Reality. Unfiltered., commonly known as *TRU*, is North Carolina's first-ever statewide youth tobacco prevention multi-media campaign that uses testimonials of real North Carolina teens as well as hard-hitting facts to dissuade young people from using tobacco. This campaign is part of the NC Health and Wellness Trust Fund's (HWTF) teen tobacco use prevention initiative. Funded at \$28 million from HWTF, this grassroots initiative includes the *TRU* media campaign, as well as a grant program including 70 grants (50 community-based grants, 4 statewide grants and 16 tobacco free school mini-grants) to a total of 55 organizations. Event Background: The Council on Adolescents will be setting up tobacco informational booths during lunchtime at three area high schools. The booths will have cessation information, prevention brochures, the lung comparison kit, the jar of tar, and students will receive incentives. The Catawba County Health Department will be setting up display tables outside each clinic (spit tobacco at dental, pregnancy and smoking at prenatal, teen smoking at the teen clinic, etc.), Ciggy Butts will be giving out stickers and incentives, the lung comparison kit and jar of tar will be set up in the lobby, prevention announcements will be read over the PA system all day, and patients and visitors will be encouraged to trade in their tobacco products for tobacco survival kits.
